Curriculum Topics – Summer Term 2022



Topic

The topic for this term is 'Journeys'.

Communication and Language

The children will continue to build their vocabulary and develop their language. They will use language to add detail into descriptions and connect ideas, developing their sentence structure to make their stories more exciting, and improve their ability to express their ideas, thoughts and opinions. Finally, we will continue to develop listening skills, by listening carefully to others and responding appropriately.



Physical Development

The children will continue to take part in weekly P.E. lessons; focusing on refining their balance and coordination and developing their ball skills through learning a variety of throwing and catching skills. In our outside area, they will continue to improve their ball skills through throwing, catching and bat and ball games. The children's pencil control is improving; we will continue to develop this through writing with more focus, clarity, skill and strength.





<u>Literacy</u>

The children will be focusing on their writing skills this term and developing their ability to write sentences. They will share a variety of texts and rhymes during carpet times and write invitations, letters, lists, story-maps and poems during shared writing times, learning the stories and re-inventing them with their own ideas, before writing about them. The children will work in small groups to practise and develop these skills. They will continue to learn new sounds in phonics, as well as practise and develop their blending skills. They will take part in reading activities, sharing their thoughts and ideas about stories they have read and write book reviews to share with each other.



Mathematics

This term the children will develop their problem-solving skills through addition and subtraction, as well as doubling, halving and sharing quantities. The children will use a variety of resources and tools to help them visualise numbers and solve the problems in practical and real-life contexts. They will develop their ability to record their findings and explain what they have found out and how. The children will also continue to explore shapes and describing these, and capacity and size through measurements and comparisons.

Understanding the World

As we move from Spring to Summer, the children will observe the changing natural environment around us by focussing on bug hunting, pond dipping and bird watching, as well as caring for our class caterpillars and observing their life cycle. We will use the iPads to research information and begin to learn how to programme computers using robotic mice. The children will discuss celebrations and also traditions, learning about similarities and differences between themselves and others.



The children will create art independently using a variety of resources and their previous experiences to make decisions. They will create 3D vehicles, with a focus on planning and evaluating their work, as well as making a moving part. They will learn about rhythm and beat through the use of musical instruments, and will be singing regularly and listening to a variety of musical instruments. The children have access to small world play, role play and a variety of large and small construction materials.
