Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the new summer term. We hope you enjoyed your Easter holidays and your children are looking forward to the term. Please find below a summary of Year 1's main learning areas for this term.

### **Notices**

### **P.E.**

### Reading

Your children have all been given reading books. Make sure you read little and often, and most importantly keep it fun! **Topic** 

The topic for this term is 'Journeys'. We

will be learning about journeys on

vehicles, such as rockets, trains and

boats, as well as journeys through life,

learning about life cycles of plants and

animals. The children will learn about

endangered animals and their risk of

extinction and ways we can help them.

They will also learn about the journey of

butterflies to Africa in Geography and

then learn about the History of parts of Africa and the impact Nelson Mandela

had on this.

## **Curriculum Topics – Summer Term 2022**



## **Communication and Language**

The children will continue to extend their vocabulary by describing places and animals. They will use adjectives and adverbs to make these detailed and clear. They will develop their ability to express their ideas, thoughts and opinions clearly, as well as listening carefully to others.



### **Physical Development**

The children will continue to take part in weekly P.E. lessons; focusing on moving different ways and playing team sports. In our outside area, they will continue to develop their ball skills and move safely in different ways. To improve the children's handwriting, they will take part in daily handwriting practise, focusing on letter formation.

### **Mathematics**

This term the children will consolidate their number fact knowledge, especially number bonds within 10. They will use this knowledge and the links between addition and subtraction to solve word problems and explain their thinking and their answers. As they work with numbers up to 100, they will use a variety of resources independently, such as 100-squares, numberlines, numicon and bead strings. They will record their findings in small focused group work. They will also continue practising counting in 2's, 5's and 10's, and use this to solve division and multiplication problems.





### **Literacy**

The children will continue with their phonics, focussing on segmenting and blending, as well as learning the phase 5 sounds. They will be reading sentences with detail and length with a greater fluency and pace. As the children write everyday, they will develop their writing by composing more detailed sentences including conjunctions, adjectives adverbs. They will share a variety of texts and rhymes during carpet times and will write invitations, letters, lists, story maps, poems, instructions and information texts during shared writing times, before writing these independently. When the children have read story books, they will discuss these using their ideas and knowledge, sharing their thoughts and ideas about the story as well as writing book reviews.



# Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The children will develop their ability to communicate in small groups, sharing ideas and methods, particularly focussing on doing this independently. They will talk to others about their needs, describing and explaining them. The children will continue to learn how to talk about their emotions and communicate them effectively to those around them, especially using them to solve any conflicts or problems effectively and in a thoughtful manner.

### **Understanding the World**

As we move from Spring to Summer, the children will observe the changing natural environment around us by focussing on bug hunting, pond dipping and bird watching, as well as caring for our class caterpillars and observing their life cycle. We will use the iPads to research information through QR codes and google searches. The children will continue to learn about conducting investigations and fair experiments, making predictions and drawing conclusions. They will investigate the impact different sugars and salts have on plants and use this knowledge to find out what impact this may have on their bodies, as well as the best way to care for the beanstalks and plants they have grown from seed.

## **Expressive Arts and Design**

The children will create vehicles with moving parts, using wheels and axles and experimenting with different joins and joining materials. They will create art independently using their ideas and inspiration from artists such as Goldsworthy to plan and then create a variety of paintings and natural art. They will take part in singing sessions and use musical instruments to add rhythm to their songs. They will also listen to a variety of instruments and music genres, discussing tone, pitch and the feelings the music creates. The children will have access to small world play and role play such as construction sites and construction materials.
