Dear Parents

We have made a brilliant start to the New Year and the children have been busy starting their new topics. I am really pleased that the children have moved from Little Gems into Gems Nursery class smoothly and are enjoying the new experiences.

During the two training days at the start of term our focus was literacy where all the staff were trained in Read, Write Inc. This programme focuses on phonics, spelling, reading and writing from Reception to Year 2. We are in the early stages of introducing the programme but already your child may have told you about Fred the Frog and some rhymes to support writing letters. After half term we will be holding a parents workshop to inform you more about the sounds, the reading books and how you can get involved. Young Voices

On Monday 26th January Year 6 had the experience of a lifetime when they performed in a Young Voices concert at the O2 arena in London. Alongside thousands of other children, in the world's largest children's choir, they sang the songs that they had been learning since September and also had the opportunity to watch performances by leading young guest artists. The atmosphere in the arena was electric and many of the children described the day as, "The best of my life!" One child wrote, "I sang my heart out when the music started even when, towards the end of the show, I was losing my voice." All the accompanying staff were incredibly proud of the children's behaviour, achievement and commitment.

Parking

Castles Day

The afternoon was very different. The children arrived in the hall with a gasp it had been transformed into the banqueting hall of a castle. School Uniform

Children need to have their PE kit and a pair of wellies in school at all times. As a reminder, the standard uniform consists of:

- White or blue polo shirts (plain)
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore with the length of skirt to be no shorter than just above the knee
- Grey or white socks, royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan (available from school with the school emblem)
- Royal blue pullover or cardigan.
- Black footwear, shoes (not trainers)

Hair – all long hair to be tied back, so that your child's vision is not impaired. Girls and boys may wear gel, ponytails or hair bands, but no extreme fashion hairstyles please. **Please** name every item of your child's school uniform.

<u>PE Kit</u>

The children need a plain white t-shirt and plain blue/navy or black shorts. Please avoid strappy tops for the girls.

If your child comes to school without the appropriate items or kit a letter will be sent home with them indicating the missing item or appropriate school wear.

Uniform points will not be given out to pupils if they do not have the correct kit. If children do not gain enough points over the term they will need to come to school in their uniform on reward day.

School Dinners

The cost of a meal at school for children in Year 3, 4 5 & 6 is £2.15 and for children in Nursery the cost is £1.90 per child from September. Adult meals are charged at £3.00 per adult. Payment can now be made online. Your child should have come home with a letter regarding online payments, however, if this has not been received or you need help with setting this up please contact the office. You may order lunches on a daily basis but according to Local Authority's policy, all school lunches must be paid for in advance or on the day taken. School is not allowed to give more than one day's credit per child. As you know, any parent, grandparent, aunt or uncle can book to have a dinner with a child in the school any day of the week but we do require at least one day's notice where possible.
