The Key Stage Two children challenged themselves in their events. All of the children were fantastic and had a great Sports Day making all of the adults proud. It was lovely to hear so many parents comment on how much they enjoyed the events.

Reception school trip Paxton Pits

Reception went to Paxton Pits on their school trip last week. The children took part in bug hunting, bird watching and pond dipping, exploring and finding out about all the animals that live on and around the nature reserve. They absolutely loved using the fantastic resources that the Environmental Education Centre provided them with and they learnt a lot about the animals and their habitats. They were impeccably behaved and we were extremely proud of all of them.

Year 1 and 2 school trip to Hunstanton Beach

On Wednesday 11th July, KS1 travelled to Old Hunstanton. They had a wonderful time playing in the sand, building sandcastles and paddling in the sea. Some even buried each other (and some staff!). Their behaviour was fantastic throughout the day and they also enjoyed their ice lolly at the end of the day.

Year 3 school trip to Kew Gardens

To link with their Science work on plants and their Geography learning about the Amazonian Rainforest, Year 3 visited Kew Gardens for the day. Despite the very high temperatures, they all had a brilliant time and were stunned by incredible plants and trees. Particular highlights were the slightly scary 'Treetop Walkway', the hot and humid tropical house where they saw bananas and coffee growing, the stunning 'Hive' which had flashing lights to mirror the communications of bees in a real hive and also the amazing cacti in the Princess of Wales glasshouse. The children even saw tropical fish and a real iguana but Miss Smith's favourite was the Lily House with its beautiful flowers and enormous lily pads.

Year 3 trip to Poetry Festival

Year 3 were fantastic at the St Neots Poetry Festival in the Priory Centre at the beginning of July. They behaved beautifully and performed their poems brilliantly. They remembered all the actions for 'The Blind men and the Elephant' and were complimented on their use of props and sound effects in the 'Ning, Nang, Nong'.

Year 5 School Trip National Space Centre Leicester

On Friday the 29th of June, Year 5 children went to the National Space Centre in Leicester. They had a fantastic day exploring the range of exhibitions, learning about the universe and our solar system. They visited the Sir Patrick Moor Planetarium where they watched a film about being an astronaut; the effects were amazing! All the children enjoyed the interactive activities, especially the huge Thor rocket.

The children looked at hydraulics and completed a number of scientific challenges. We hope this has inspired them to continue to work hard in science and maths at secondary school, and thank Bosch for volunteering their time to support the school.

Parking

The school car park will be locked from 8:30am to 9:15am and 2:45pm to 3:30pm. Parents and staff will not be allowed to drive into the school car park at these times. Please ensure you park considerately outside of the school, ensuring you do not block anyone's driveway or emergency access point.

Red Post Box in Office Reception Area

Envelopes and forms should be posted in the red quick drop box in the office reception area, please ensure all items are clearly named and easily identifiable. We encourage you to use this facility to save you time unnecessarily waiting.

Little Gems Before and After School Club

Please can I remind you that all bookings and cancellations should be made via the school office. 24 hours notice must be given if your child cannot attend a session to avoid being charged. Breakfast is between 7.30am and 8.30am. Please let the staff know if your child has not had breakfast at home. Children attending after school club sessions from 4.30pm onwards will be provided with tea. Please speak to staff if you wish to see the menu.

Term time holidays

Following Government Guidance, we as a Trust do not authorise leave during term time unless there are extra ordinary circumstances, which are judged on an individual basis. As a result of this we will apply to the Local Authority for a penalty notice if you take a child out of school for any unauthorised leave of more than 5 days.

School Uniform

Children need to have their PE kit and a pair of wellies in school at all times.

As a reminder, the standard uniform consists of:

- White or blue polo shirts (plain)
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore with the length of skirt to be no shorter than just above the knee
- Grey or white socks, royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan (available from school with the school emblem)
- Royal blue pullover or cardigan.
- Black footwear, shoes (not trainers)

Hair – all long hair to be tied back, so that your child's vision is not impaired. Girls and boys may wear gel, ponytails or hair bands, but no extreme fashion hairstyles please. Please name every item of your child's school uniform. It is The Diamond Learning Partnership Trusts policy that earrings must not be worn for PE, and your child must be able to remove them if they wear them to school on PE days. Earrings should be small studs.

PE Kit

The children need a plain white t-shirt and plain blue/navy or black shorts. Please avoid strappy tops for the girls.

If your child comes to school without the appropriate items or kit a letter will be sent home with them indicating the missing item or appropriate school wear.

Uniform points will not be given out to pupils if they do not have the correct kit. If children do not gain enough points over the term they will need to come to school in their uniform on reward day.

School Dinners

The cost of a meal at school for children in Year 3, 4 5 & 6 from September is £2.25; adult meals will be £3.20. Payment can now be made online, please ask the office staff for more information. You may order lunches on a daily basis but according to Local Authority's policy, all school lunches must be paid for in advance or on the day taken. School is not allowed to give more than one day's credit per child. As you know, any parent, grandparent, aunt or uncle can book to have a dinner with a child in the school any day of the week but we do require at least one day's notice where possible.
