We understand that everyone is genuinely ill at some point and this may lead students to miss a day or two of school, which is permissible, but that should be a rare occurrence and not the norm.

Class teachers will send home further information about class timetables, rules, routines, topics and closed Facebook pages next week. Please remember to check book bags and the school website regularly. Once we have settled into the first term, we shall endeavour to send home all letters and leaflets on Fridays.

Winhills Primary Academy School Uniform

Please ensure all children attend school daily wearing the correct school uniform. We encourage all students to wear school uniform as we feel this gives them a sense of identity and pride in their school.

School Uniform

Plain white or plain, pale blue polo shirt

Grey trousers / knee length skirt / pinafore

Grey or white socks / navy blue tights

Comfortable, flat black shoes with closed heels and toes

Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan (available from the school office with the school emblem)

Royal blue jumper or cardigan

A warm, waterproof winter coat (suitable for school and brought to school daily)

A pair of wellingtons (to be kept in school at all times)

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PE / Sports - Students need to have their PE kit in school at all times.

Plain white t-shirt - no strappy tops
Plain black or plain blue shorts

Indoor PE

Pupils do indoor PE in bare feet.

Outdoor PE

Trainers must be worn for games outdoors (not school shoes).

KS2 pupils will need a plain tracksuit for outdoor games in the winter.

Hair

Students may wear a small amount of hair gel but no extreme fashion hairstyles. If your child's hair is long enough, please ensure it is tied back and kept away from their eyes at all times so that their vision is not impaired. Hair accessories should be plain black, blue or white.

Jewellery

No nail varnish or jewellery should be worn in school. Reasonable exceptions are inexpensive watches, small stud earrings or religious items. It is The Diamond Learning Partnership Trust's policy that earrings must NOT be worn for PE and your child must be able to remove them on PE days. For Health and Safety reasons, the school does not permit any body piercing (apart from small earrings).

Sun Protection

Please provide a hat or cap for your child to wear during hot, sunny weather. Sun creams should be named and are the responsibility of the child. Shoulders and necks should be covered up.

Water bottles

All children should have a water bottle in school.

All belongings, including clothing, should be clearly marked with your child's name.

School Car Park

Please be aware:

To help **ensure the safety of the children** in school, the **car park gates will be locked** daily between **8:30am—9:15am** and again from **2:45pm—3:30pm**.

Please can we also request that both entrance and exit gates are left clear at all times.

By responsibly working together, we shall help to keep our students safe. Thank you.

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
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Primary Students - Monday 5th September 2016


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
