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Attendance and Punctuality

Attendance

First of all I would like to thank all the parents and carers of children who attend school regularly and punctually, we have 31 children who have 100% attendance since September and 85 children who are above the National Average of 96.1%.

Unfortunately we have 54 children below 96.1% and 26 children below 90%. If a child has an attendance level of below 90% the Government categorise them as being Persistent Absentees and we as a school are required to challenge parents. As part of this challenge, where attendance does not improve, we are required to apply to the County Council for a Penalty notice to be issued. Since November 2016 we have applied for 3 penalty notices due to poor attendance, all of which have been agreed and issued.

Punctuality

During January there were 73 late sessions recorded for children arriving between 8.55am and 9.05am and 64 sessions of unauthorised lates recorded for children arriving after 9.05am. If any child receives more than 10 U marks within a six week period then we are again required to apply for a Penalty Notice to be issued from the County Council. If your child receives 5 U marks then we will write to warn you that you are at risk of a Penalty Notice.

If you are struggling with punctuality or attendance, we can offer support so please call into the office or speak to your child's teacher.

If your child is 5 minutes late every day they will lose three days of learning each year.



Challenge Your Child



Maths:

Find a great variety of ways of asking questions which make 8.

For example: "What is half of 16?" "What is four-fifths of 10?"

Use whatever mathematics you know to find as many different ways of getting the answer 8.

Use addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions, decimals, etc.

For example: 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = 8 50 - 42 = 8 $4 \times 2 = 8$ $64 \div 8 = 8$ $2 \cdot 1/2 + 5 \cdot 1/2 = 8$ 4.7 + 3.3 = 8

Now change the 8 to a different number.

You may find some patterns that would go on for ever and ever. If you do, just put down a few, and then see if you can describe how the pattern works.
