These will then be quizzed on a Monday.</p>	<p>Children are expected to complete 45 minutes of Maths Whizz and 15 minutes of TT Rockstars each week.</p> <p>This will be monitored weekly in school.</p> <p>If there is no internet access at home, children should complete in school (having an option of homework club).</p>	<p>This term, children are expected to spend some time at home revising for SATs.</p> <p>School will provide revision material for children to use at home and will then re-review during 'booster sessions' in school.</p>	<p>PE is taught on a Wednesday afternoon (by Mr Franco).</p> <p>In addition, for the first half of the Spring Term, the children will have swimming lessons on a Friday morning at One Leisure.</p> <p>For ease, please ensure Wednesday PE kit is kept in school.
