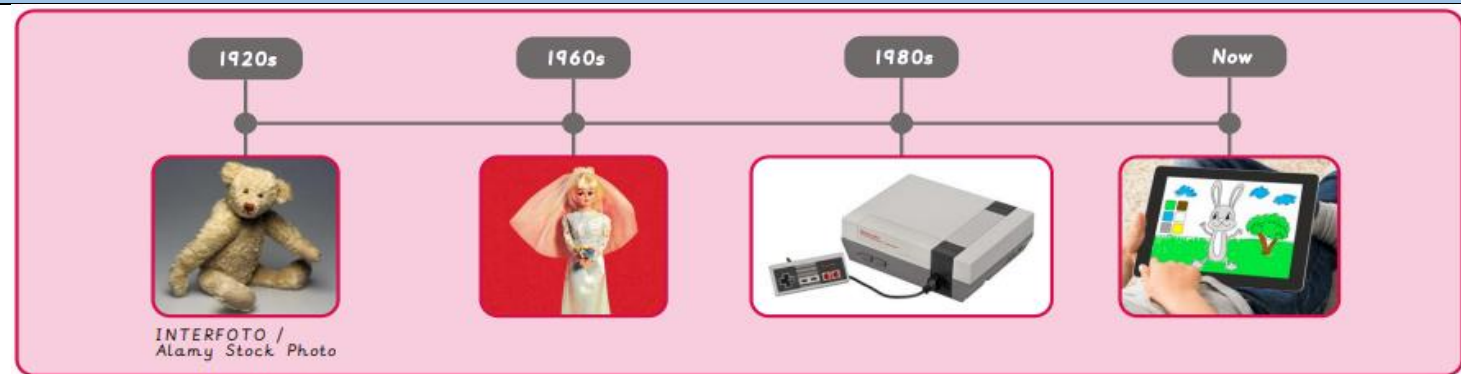


Our Year 1 History topic next term is 'How have toys changed?'
