Literacy

Year 2: The children have continued working on their own versions of Cinderella. They have learnt about the effects punctuation can have upon their audience; the reader. Numeracy

Year 2: The children have learnt to read the time, both digital and analogue so test them on their new knowledge! They are now investigating the use of the 'inverse', addition and subtraction number sentences. If we know 8+2=10 then we know 2+8=10 and we know 10-8=2 as well as 10-2=8 Year 3: Moonstone Class have been exploring shape. The children have looked and found 2D and 3D shapes inside and outside the classroom. Year three will continue to investigate different properties of shapes and how

Year 4: In year 4, the children have been sorting 2D shapes using properties such as parallel lines and perpendicular lines.

Science

Year 2: Continuing with their topic of humans and animals, the children have developed their understanding of germs. They carried out an investigation into the best way of removing bacteria.

Year 3: The children have been busy planning their own investigations to find out about the force friction. The children will be learning and finding out the effects of different forces all around us.
