<u>Literacy</u>

Year 5 have been doing lots of grammar and punctuation revision, making sure that they can name nouns, pronouns, verbs, adverbs, adjectives and prepositions.

To link with their current topic, Year 5 are reading a text about Odysseus. They have been making character inferences and predictions as well as finding out about classic Greek storytelling.

<u>Maths</u>

Year 5 have learnt about transforming 2D shapes by rotation, translation and reflection. They even made transformation board games to help them remember what to do. They have also practised converting percentages to fractions and decimals...and back again.

Ancient Greece

Year 5's brilliant visit to Cambridge last week provided a great stimulus to learning about the ancient 'city states' and the differences between Athens and Sparta. They have made a timeline of Ancient Greece and made 3D pictures of the Parthenon.
